Emilie Autumn Crockett St. Jacques, born Nov. 4, 1975, passed away at her home in Nevada City on the morning of Feb. 13, 2015.

She is survived by her mother, Denice McKague; father Chris Crockett; sister Michelle Young; husband Erik St. Jacques; and two children, Electra and Max Cassano.

To the community of Nevada City, Emilie was nothing short of a celebrity. Honored in 1997 with an award for Rising Star for Women in the Arts, she was famous (and sometimes infamous) for her avant-garde fashion shows, her hilarious, ingenious artwork, and large-scale practical jokes — like the time she, in the dark of night, hid over 500 hand-dyed Easter eggs throughout the downtown district. The next morning residents, tourists, and shop owners discovered them with astonished, befuddled delight. It was, after all, the middle of a rainy November.

Emilie's greatest joy was making people smile when they least expected to. If she were here, writing this, she would tell you to stop reading her obituary and, instead, eat your favorite treat, prank someone you love, sing at the top of your lungs, or leave a secret message somewhere for a stranger to discover later.
