Ronald "Brad" Bradley passed away April 16, 2015.

He was born Nov. 25, 1927, in Altoona, Pennsylvania to Paul and Vada Bradley.

Brad worked for the Pennsylvania Rail Road before enlisting in the United States Marine Corps in October 1945. He served in both the Corps and the Air Force until his retirement.

In 1966, Brad started his second career with the U.S. Forest Service ending in his retirement in 1997. In the spring of 1997 Brad was asked to help move the boats from Sitka to Warm Springs Bay, Alaska, to the fishing lodge. That was the start of his maintenance guru job for the next 15 years.
